The Black Pirate-



First released on March 8, 1926, the movie was filmed on the Channel and Santa Catalina Islands. The plot is a tale of revenge and love-a young man joins a pirate band to avenge his father's death. Billie Dove plays the fair damsel kidnapped by the pirates and in need of rescue. Douglas Fairbanks wrote a timeless tale of adventure and romance that inspires Hollywood to this day. All pirate films for the last 82 years surely pay homage to this film. This film has been in demand by silent film buffs of late for just that reason. Adam's Pack Station Event:

The Historical Society has booked an exciting event for members and friends. We have arranged with **Deb** and **Sue Burgess**, owners of the Adam's Pack Station, for a packing demonstration at the Pack Station. The Pack Station is located in Chantry Flat, in the heart of Big Santa Anita Canyon. According to their web site (www.adamspackstation.com) the camp is "one of the most popular and historically significant spots in the Angeles National Forest. This is thought to be the last pack station of its kind in the United States."

The date for the event is Saturday, March 15, 1:30 PM in the Adam's Pack Station Picnic Grove. The

Picnic Grove is handicapped accessible. Follow Santa Anita Avenue north out of Sierra Madre and follow the signs. The program is FREE. Light refreshments will be served. In Memoriam: John Grijalva

Sierra Madre lost one of its own unique treasures on Sunday, December 9 with the passing of John Grijalva. John was born in Los Angeles on December 18, 1928 and died just nine

days short of his 79th birthday. His family: his mom, two brothers and a sister moved to Sierra Madre when John was 7 or 8 years old. His family made numerous moves during John's teenage years, but John found his way back to Sierra Madre and never left. He married his wife Mignon nee (Murphy) in 1949 and they raised two sons, Steve and John. John loved Sierra Madre and Sierra Madre loved John. He was honored by being named the Grand Marshal of the 4th of July Parade (2003), Older American of the Year (2004), and Citizen of the Year (2006). John gave back with the Veteran's Memorial Wall, many years of hosting Pioneer Days reunions and countless other projects in town. The reunions have been held in October most years since 1998 when Pioneer Days was revived. They brought together many old Sierra Madre families, former residents and friends to exchange stories, photos and loving memories. John helped the Archives tremen-dously by inviting Debbie Henderson, the Sierra Madre Library archivist, to Pioneer Days activities and introducing her to many long time Sierra Madre residents. John also introduced Sierra Madre Centennial Book author Michele Zack to many Sierra Madreans.

Library staff also worked closely with John on the Veteran's Photo Wall. **Gerard Brane** scanned the images using equipment at the Library so we have a substantial digital archive of Sierra Madre servicemen and women. The Archives also preserves and provides access to the information sheets about each veteran.
